Contact the local or State Department of Health

Report that your loved one has been diagnosed with Legionnaires' Disease by calling the health department immediately. You can usually find the contact information for your state's health department on their website. Provide your loved one's name, date of birth, diagnosis date, and possible exposure location(s). Legionnaires' Disease is a reportable disease in every jurisdiction, and the only way to prevent a second exposure is to notify the authorities and have it recorded.



Determine the Likely Source and Have it Tested

Potential sources include cooling towers, hot tubs, decorative fountains, and plumbing systems. Think about places your loved one visited in the weeks before their illness, such as hotels, hospitals, or public buildings. Not every state and local health department requires a test of the location, or an investigation. Most states only test and investigate where there are two or more exposures. If the authority will not test, then do your own test. (We can help!)
